It Looks Like Life, But It's Only Activity

"And the life that I now live in my body, I live by faith, indeed, by the faithfulness of God's son who loved me and gave himself for me"
(Galatians 2:20)

Sometimes the research I conduct for writing projects takes me into new worlds-like the realm of deep brain trauma and terms like, "perpetual vegetative state" and vegetative state versus perpetual vegetative state. My empathy for the ill and the families who know the details of these conditions grew as I studied what they mean and what those illnesses looked like and the challenges they posed for the medical teams and family members. There was love from the family members in spite of the lack of response from the one who was loved. I've watched videos documenting daily life for family members of those with loved ones who couldn't move, communicate, or even breathe on their own. There were brief moments that sent hope soaring when they thought it might mean their loved one was emerging from the comatose state. Then, hope sank when it became obvious that the movement was an involuntary spasm. "It looks like life, but it's only activity" a nurse would explain.

What happens to the heart of Jesus when our flailing reveals itself to be mere activity? Perhaps when we read our Bibles solely to mark off reading another daily devotion on our calendars, or we say the wrong words while stifling the right words. It looks like life on the surface, but its activity that's as heart breaking for the one hovering over us. Who longs to see us come alive in Him, as it is for a family waiting for a sign.

Jesus loves despite the fact that the ones he loves sometimes show a lack of response. Is that who you want to be—an unresponsive follower, twitching with activity, but having no real life? Yes, we often forget or neglect those who suffer or are in pain, but not Jesus. He loves us all, more than we can imagine. Leo Tolstoy wrote in his tales in 1885, "But now I understand that the best way to keep one's vows to God and to do his will is for each man, while he still lives, to show love and do good to others, because where love is—God is." What a statement from a Russian poet!

Faith step: Observe your activities over the next twenty-four hours. Are there pure hearted signs of the life of Christ within you? If so, then press on! Love and peace to you!
