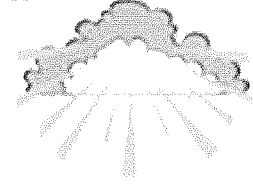

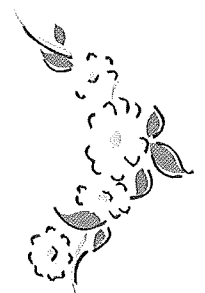

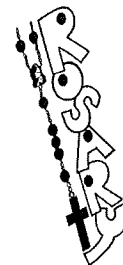

Hodge Excavating and A & W Concrete were hired to remove the existing concrete and pour and finish a new surface. The area was between the driveway and the church doors and out into the right and left side walks. Thanks to the Administration Commission for their management of this project which cost around \$11,000. In the coming months we will be attending to other issues with the outside stairs and walkways. We will also finish the landscaping in front of the religious education classrooms.
