Behold Thy Mother

The National Shrine of Mary, the Mother of God

A little bit of heaven is tucked away within the Ozark hills of Missouri. The Mother's Shrine is a magnificent National Shrine, dedicated to Mary, Mother of the Church, located on the beautiful west side of the Lake of the Ozarks, between Versailles and Camdenton, Missouri.

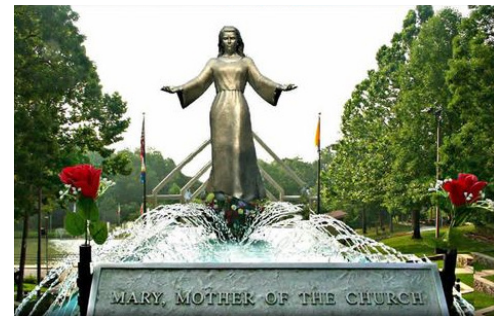
The Shrine is the 16th National Shrine in the United States. With its awe-inspiring fourteen-foot stainless steel sculpture of Mary as the Mother of the Church, with her arms outstretched, the Shrine welcomes all to her embrace. Dedicated to motherhood, it is one of the most meaningful shrines in our country. There are hundreds of monuments dedicated to heroic men and women, but this is the only shrine in the world that honors mothers.

The terraced amphitheater surrounding the sculpture seats 6,000. Behind the altar is a three-tiered lighted super structure of steel towers, which creates a spectacularly lovely effect; fountains, pools and a waterfall flow from the upper pool over which the sculpture of Mary towers. Each spring, 25,000 flowers are in bloom throughout the grounds.

The Mothers' Wall, dedicated to motherhood, makes this one of the most meaningful Shrines in the country, with names of mothers' throughout the world engraved in the beautiful black granite that surrounds the fountains of the upper pool where the sculpture of Mary is standing. It is a tribute to

all mothers, living or deceased, regardless of religious affiliation.

First-class relics of the saints are displayed in St. Patrick's Church which is part of our campus. A relic is a piece of the body of a saint, an item owned or used by the saint, or an object which has been touched to the tomb of a saint. There are three classes of sacred relics. The first-class is a part of the saint's body. The second-class is a piece of the saint's clothing or something used by the saint, while the third-class is an object which has been touched to a first-class relic. The relics of the saints and their veneration is just another in the long line of treasures which Jesus Christ has given to His chaste bride, the Church.

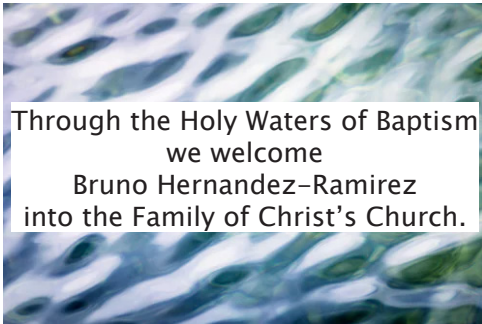

LIBRARY CORNER

MASS: AN INVITATION TO ENJOY IT

Ask yourself this question: Do I "go to church," or do I "celebrate the Eucharist"? The answer to this question is important. It is the difference between, "I don't get much out of Mass," and "Mass gives me the strength to get through the week." For many years, my answer was, "I have to go to church." As a child of the 70's and 80's, I attended CCD classes, but did not receive much catechising. I really didn't understand the why behind the things we did at Mass.

If you feel this way, I invite you to read Amy Florian's book, "Mass: An Invitation to Enjoy It." In the introduction, she likens the Mass to a family party. She goes on to explain the parts of the Mass and how the members of the congregation can be participants in the celebration and not audience members. She then describes the different seasons which affect how the Mass is celebrated, and delves into the purpose behind some of the symbols used during Mass.

I found the book to be a quick, easy read that would be a great beginning down the path to learn more about how we can experience the Mass in a more personal way.
