A Message from Monsignor Mak:

Novena to honor the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

Our parish honors Mary under the title of Our Lady of the Lake. There is an ancient custom of naming churches after the Mother of God simply by the title "Mary". For example, St. Mary Major in Rome, one of the earliest churches dedicated to Mary is known eventually as "major" or "greater" to indicate it was the biggest and most important shrine to our Blessed Mother in Rome. In France, the custom was to call a church "Our Lady of ..." to indicate the particular location of a church dedicated to Mary. For example, Notre Dame du Paris is literally "Our Lady of Paris". The University of Notre Dame has the official title Notre Dame du Lac, Our Lady of the Lake.

The liturgical calendar calls for two special celebrations each year in a parish: the anniversary of the dedication of the parish church and the patronal feast day. These days are celebrated with the greatest solemnity, an obligatory celebration that supersedes all memorials and most feasts. This custom presents a challenge for the mandated celebration of the patronal feast of

our parish since there is no liturgical celebration of Mary under the title of Our Lady of the Lake. Typically parishes then choose one of the many Marian celebrations throughout the calendar year. Not having a custom of celebrating our patroness, we have a lot of work to do to instill proper devotion and understanding.

If we truly understand the nature and scope of the community of saints, we would realize that the patrons of churches are very important members of the parish community. Parishes should turn to their patrons frequently to honor their holiness, learn from their example, and gain their intercession in time of need. It is with this understanding that we will inaugurate this year, Thursday, August 22, 2019, the Feast of the Queenship of Mary, and the solemn celebration of our patroness, Mary, the Mother of God and Queen of heaven and earth. St. Alphonse Liguori is among the many saints who explained the appropriateness of the title. He writes, "Because the virgin Mary was raised

Dear Friends in Christ,
Next weekend is our annual Diocesan Mission Collection. The Gospel for this Sunday, the Parable of the Good Samaritan, anticipates that appeal.

A scholar asks Jesus "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus answers with a story of a traveler beaten and robbed. A ritual priest and then a Levite ignore the man's plight. Then a despised Samaritan stops, binds the man's wounds, takes him to shelter and pays for his care.

This is the neighbor, the one who shows mercy, the one who loves God by loving those in need. Neighbor is not defined by proximity, ethnicity, or nationality. For the Good Samaritan, and for us, it is defined by need.

We are the Good Samaritan when we support our Mission Collection. We are binding wounds and providing care when we give to support the health ministry of Fr. Dandi Bermejo in the Philippines, to maintain parishes as compassionate communities of faith in Peru, or to feed hungry children in Mexico.

We identify as the Good Samaritan, but mission today urges us to see ourselves as the traveler in need as well. We may not have those physical needs, but priests from Africa and India are ministering to our spiritual needs. Through our mission funds, we respond by helping their churches and communities.

Mission today is a relationship, a mutual sharing of charity and mercy. Our Mission Collection makes this possible. I ask you to be generous, not because you have to, but because loving our neighbor is the way we love God.

Given all the suffering from tornadoes and flooding, some might insist that charity and mercy start at home. I agree, but we can't stop there. The episodic devastation we experience is a way of life for many. Most of us have been so abundantly

blessed that we can help both.

Asking your prayers and the intercession of St. Francis Xavier and St. Therese of Lisieux, co-patrons of the missions, I am

to such a lofty dignity as to be the mother of the King of kings, it is deservedly and by every right that the Church has honored her with the title of 'Queen'."

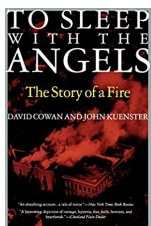
The practice of novenas to prepare for the celebration of a feast is an ancient custom. To appropriately prepare for our patronal feast, we will hold a novena of prayer beginning on Tuesday, August 13 through Wednesday, August 21. There will be special prayers at each of the masses during that time. All parishioners will be invited to participate in the most basic manner of saying specific prayers each day during the novena. The major effort will be to gather people together and pray each evening in someone's home. The evening gathering consists of the reading of a lesson, songs, the praying of the rosary and the praying of the Litany of Loreto. There is an altar set up with a stature of the Blessed Virgin and the people bring flowers and candles to decorate the altar. After the prayer, there usually is some type of simple meal to share.

We are in the initial stages of ensuring there is a host family for each night of the novena. If you are interested in hosting, please contact the parish office. We don't envision that everyone will attend all of the evening prayer services. Most important would be that the host family invites some friends and neighbors to gather together and pray. All parishioners are invited to at least spend some time in prayer each day, either using the full prayer booklet to be provided or simply praying the rosary together as a family and praying the daily novena prayer.

In the coming weeks, there will be more details published in the bulletin. This is a wonderful opportunity for our parish to grow in faith and strengthen our bonds as community. Mary, Queen of heaven and earth, pray for us!
