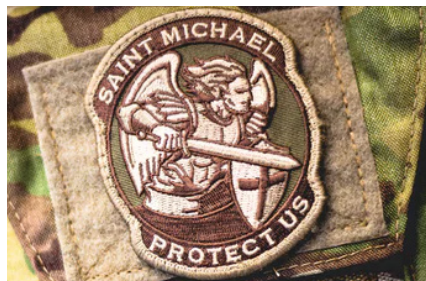

Long-Range Planning:

If you haven't taken the time to fill

We would like to have all the surveys
in by the end of August. I appreciate
all those who have taken time to fill
out a survey already.

Initial responses have been
summarized. One thing I have
already noted is that there is what in
the business world might be called
"market segmentation". We all know
that there is rarely a product that is
truly "one size fits all". The bewil-
dering variety of products and services

is very much designed to meet
different needs for different people.
We are used to getting our individual
needs met and "having it your way."
This is quite a challenge for a parish.
Even though we are "catholic" which
means universal, most often that
universal quality is made a reality by
sacrificing our individual needs and
wants to the common good.

As our parish has grown in recent
years, there is a greater challenge to
meet the faith needs of Catholics of
all generations. For example, we have
many more folks in senior living facil-
ities or folks who are unable to come
to mass regularly. We have responded
by training and commissioning more
extraordinary ministers of Holy
Communion to share that ministry.

Our student population has
increased rapidly. The religious
education rooms are fine for 6-8
students, but we are stretched to
provide a suitable classroom for the
fifteen students that might be in
one grade. But with growth, comes
increased resources.

We are many, and learning how to
share our time, talent and treasure
by identifying needs and planning for
a future to meet those needs is an
exciting project for all of us. Please
let us know what matters to you and
your family. Thanks again to the
Administration Commission for their
leadership in this project.
