

Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) Procession the weekend masses.

Celebrated the first Sunday after the feast of the Trinity. St. Juliana, a young Belgian nun in Retinne in the thirteenth century, while in prayer received the inspiration for a feast that celebrates and promotes the gift of the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist, and from that moment, the Feast of Corpus Christi spread throughout the province, continent, and world.

On Holy Thursday, we walk with Jesus to the Mount of Olives, to keep watch with him on the night of his betrayal. The sacrament is carried in the ciborium, covered with the humeral veil: and Christ's glory too, is veiled as he undergoes the Passion. On Corpus Christi, we walk in the afterglow of Eastertide, in company with the Risen Lord. This time, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a monstrance: the Lord's glory is not hidden, but visible to all. Corpus Christi is one of the most Catholic of days, an expression of our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.



It Isn't Me By Gunther F. Skaletz

"All treasures of wisdom and knowledge are hidden in Him" [Jesus] (Colossians 2:3)

While leafing through the pages of one of my six journals where the pages are full of mu writings, I came across this one: As one of the most celebrated orchestral conductors of the twentieth century, Arturo Toscanini is remembered for his desire to give credit to whom credit is due. In David Ewan's, Dictators of the Baton, the author describes how members of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, "...Rose to their feet and cheered Toscanini at t he end of a rehearsal of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony" (which is one of my favorite ones). "When there was a lull in the ovation, and with tears in his eyes, Arturo's broken voice could be heard exclaiming as he spoke, "It isn't me...its Beethoven...Toscanini is nothing."

In the apostle Paul's New Testament Letters, he also refused to take credit for his spiritual insight and influence. He know he was regarded as a spiritual father and mother to many who had put their faith in Christ because of his inspired testimony. He admitted he had worked hard and suffered much to encourage the faith, hope and live of so many" (1 Corinthians 15:10). But he could not, in good conscience, accept the applause of those who were inspired by his faith, love and insight. So, for his readers' sake, and for ours, Paul said, in effect, "It isn't me brothers and sisters, its Christ...Paul is nothing." We are only messengers of Jesus; he's the one who deserves our cheers and unequivocal love. May His peace and love be with you.

The Catholic Church has been given the commandment to evangelize all peoples. It is our duty to spread the Good News of workings of the Holy Spirit among us. The Catholic Missourian is the primary print instrument the Diocese of Jefferson City uses to coordinate our efforts. In the past year, the Diocese has done surveys and focus groups to exam this issue. Even in this day of increased technology, surveys have shown that our core audience requires a print medium. Even as the Diocese expands its online presence, it is essential that we continue a printed newspaper, and to provide a newspaper, there has to be enough subscriptions to support it. Policy is that all parishes in the Diocese subsidize a copy for each of its families. This subsidy ensures that we are able to have a diocesan newspaper. Considering what we pay for cable or satellite a month, texting, mobile phones and internet, \$14 is a bargain for a year's subscription. Please use your green envelope for the Catholic Missourian subscription and ensure that we meet our obligation to spread the Good News.
