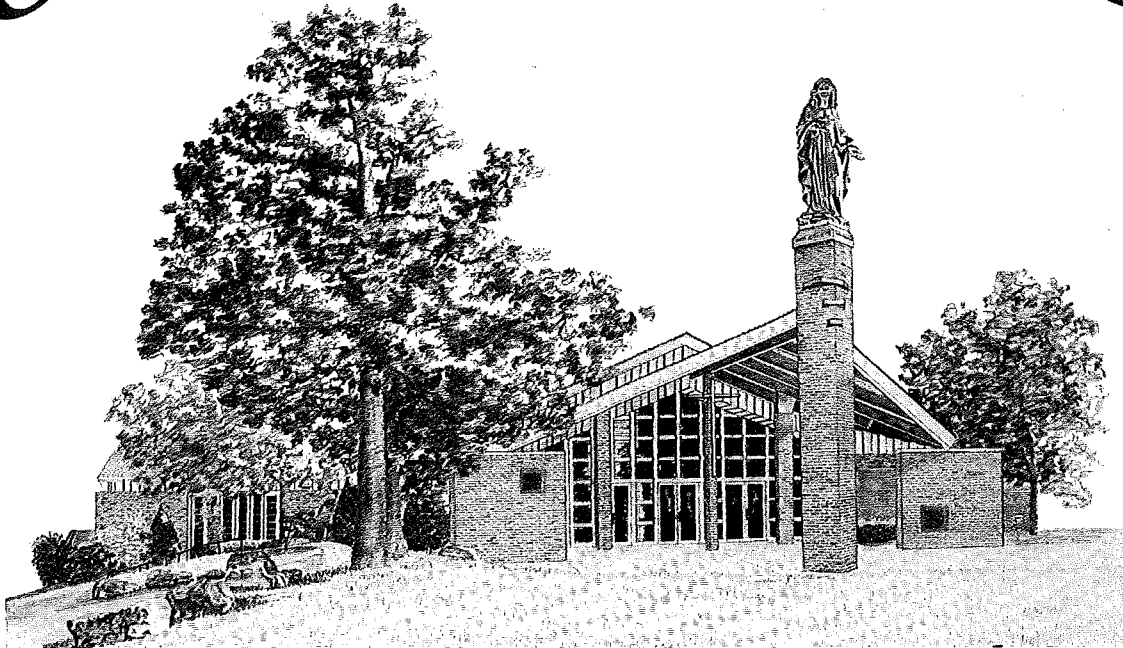

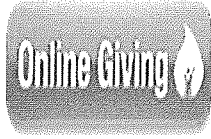

Do Not Be Ashamed of the Testimony By Gunther F. Skaletz

“So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner. Rather, join with me in suffering for the Gospel by the power of God.”
(2 Timothy, 1:1-18)

I was invited to be the guest speaker at the St. Norbert College in Green Bay, Wisconsin by Professor Dr. Struttforth where the student body was comprised of students from virtually all over the globe. There were even students from Johannesburg, South Africa. As I prepared for my speech, I looked around the auditorium and I came to the conclusion that my approach should be simple. In certain segments of my speech I've talked about my longing for love.

As a young boy growing up in Poland, and later as a teen that found salvation I experienced how Jesus transformed my life. My story revealed all the ways I've fallen short and all the ways I've been redeemed. I remember it very distinctively; there was complete silence in the auditorium after my talk. Then, a tall, regal woman walked down the long middle aisle and approached me. With fine features and flawless ebony skin she reminded me of a beautiful African Queen from a children's story book. She approached me gracefully, but when our eyes met she said, “The love you were looking for as a teen, is the same love I've been looking for, for over twenty years” she told me with tears in her eyes, “I know now that I won't find it in a relationship with men, but in a relationship with Jesus. I need to feel His love first. Only when I know His love will I be prepared to look for love in other places. As she said these words my eyes also started to fill with tears and we cried and prayed together. As I watched this beautiful woman walk away, I was impressed by the power of God she displayed through the sharing of her testimonies. When we declare Jesus's marvelous deed to another person, we make hard to understand concepts, personal. And when they see the changes in our lives, they dare to hope for the same in themselves. And because Jesus is faithful, they will not be disappointed.

This visit to the St. Norbert College was undoubtedly the most significant encounter I had experienced with students in a very long time. Amen!

Ministry of Prayer and Praise:

As the Ministry Coordinator for Prayer and Devotion for the Worship Commission, it is my pleasure to invite parishioners and friends of Our Lady of the Lake Catholic Church to join together in forming a new prayer group for the Ministry of Prayer and Praise. As we have heard recently in the Sunday Gospel, Jesus told a parable to his disciples "about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary." The parish office receives many requests for prayer and intercessions each week. We include them in the bulletin and at the Universal Prayers at Mass on Sunday if they request sharing the intention. To assist our Pastor, Msgr. Makarewicz in his duty to pray for his flock, and to assist each other in being open to the powerful grace of prayers of petition and praise, we have the Prayer, Petition and Intercession Prayer Group (PPI). Members of the prayer group will be instructed in prayer, given a prayer book and other aids to prayer, and publically commissioned as ministers.
