### **The Violent and Gentle Sound of Peace**

**“They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks” (Isiah 2:4)**

In our media saturated age, we are well acquainted with the sounds of war. On the evening news, we are subjected to the harsh staccato of automatic weapons, the whoosh of rockets, and the thunder of bombs. Veterans of wars and anyone who lived through all that can relate to that as well and I'm sure I'm speaking for the thousands who may physically flinch as those sounds resurrect their shell shock. Meanwhile, our children play video games that eerily mimic the horrors of battle. We are mistaken if we believe that the transitions to world peace will come quietly and gently. The prophet Isaiah reminds us that implements of war are transformed into tools of peace through the violent beating of swords into plows. Our spirits must also be reformed through the beating of anger into serenity and the pounding of hate into forgiveness. Still, faith suggests that baptismal water may be the most powerful means to this end, like the water of a stream that reshapes rough rock into smooth, sturdy stones for the building of God's peaceable kingdom. Mahatma Gandhi once said, “In God there is power-let us never underestimate the resources of God until we attempt the impossible.” What a powerful statement. Let us sow the seeds of beauty, peace, and love.

**Faith Step: Princes of Peace,** help us to disarm ourselves of the weapons of anger, resentment, bitterness and hatred. Teach us to use our hands to fashion the gifts of beauty and let us sow the seeds of love, amen. Peace and goodwill to you.
