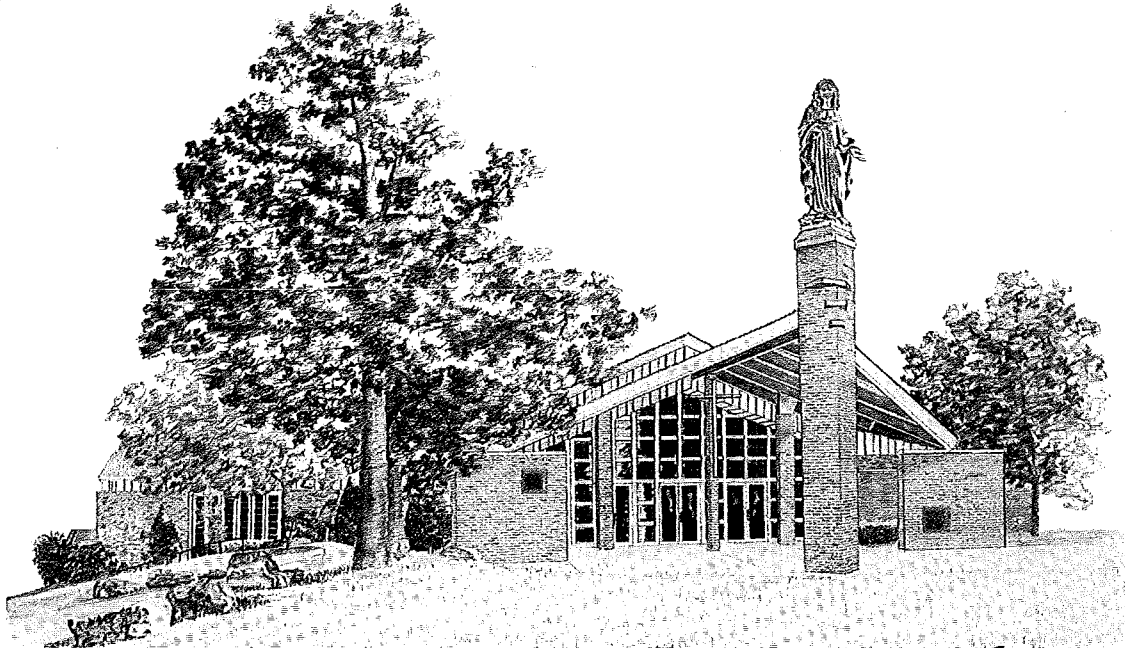

One Faith, One Family, Diocesan Celebration of Unity and Catholic Identity on Nov. 19: Please join as a member of the Diocese of Jefferson City with Bishop Gaydos as we celebrate being Catholic in mid-Missouri! The day will begin with Mass at 2pm in the Cathedral followed by a pot-luck dinner highlighting the rich food ways of people from all over the Diocese. There will be performances representing the music and dance of various cultures and backgrounds found in our Diocese. Bring your favorite dish and your friends to the Cathedral of St. Joseph at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 19th. Our Lady of the Lake is organizing a bus to bring facilitate attending this celebration which is the only Diocesan-wide event that invites people from all parishes to come together and be the local church gathered around our Bishop. Please contact the parish office to make bus reservations or make plans for your own transportation.

Sale of the Meadow Lane House: The sale of the house where Sister Virginia and Sister Joan lived has been completed. In case you missed the earlier communication, we decided that since no religious sister was likely to come to the parish any time soon, and we didn't want to go into the rental business nor maintain an empty house, it would be best to sell the house. The market was beneficial and we incurred no loss on the sale and during the years of ownership saved quite a bit with not having to pay housing costs. Due to the complexity of selling a house, we did contract a realtor to assist in the transaction. I appreciate all the hours of work that went into getting the house sold—by parishioners, the Bishop's office and office of properties at the Diocese, the realtor and especially Charlie Cassmeyer. The final sale price was \$142,000. In the coming months both the finance commission and administration commission will have new charters and we will begin the process of some long-term planning for the future of the parish. We have the education, worship and social concerns commissions up and running. They are in a better position to note the present needs of our parish and propose priorities for future growth. With new charters, the finance and administration commissions will have a more effective structure as they direct how to use our resources wisely and meet the needs of our parish. Finally, sometime in the spring, I will begin the process of chartering a parish pastor council to assist in making pastoral decisions and be a forum where the commissions can come together and work on common goals. —Msgr. Makarewicz

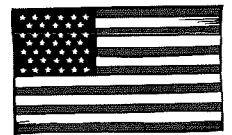
